## **Indwelling Catheter Insertion and Post Procedure Care**

Pleural effusion is a buildup of fluids in your lungs.

#### **Home Care Instructions**

- Keep a logbook for the drainage amount.
- Drain daily up to 1L/day -may abort drainage attempt if symptoms, such as chest pain, worsening shortness of breath develop. Re-attempt the following day.
- If draining 200ml or less of fluid for 3 consecutive days, notify Provider or RN at BMDA Clinic of drainage amounts, they will instruct you about any changes in drainage schedule
- Change dressing every day for the first 3 days after placement to check the incision site, then can change dressing at least once per week and if soiled/wet/dirty, please keep the tip of catheter out from under dressing

#### When to Contact Your Doctor

Call your Baptist MD Anderson oncology doctor if you have problems with the pleural catheter or if your symptoms return after treatment.

#### Watch for:

<ul> <li>More discomfort near your incisions, especially if you see pus or redness or if your skin is hot to the touch</li> </ul>
$\hfill \Box$ Discolored (more red or more white) drainage, especially if you also have a fever or flu-like symptoms
☐ Shortness of breath or sudden increase in shortness of breath
□ Chest pain
☐ More swelling or redness of the skin near the catheter
□ The catheter moves in and out at the insertion site
Follow up
Follow up in clinic in weeks.

### **Emergency Care**

In case of any emergency, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency center. For non-emergencies during business hours, call our triage line at 904-202-7300 option 3, then option 3 again.

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
